


Switzerland's population in 2020

Population


In terms of population growth, Switzerland is a dynamic country



Births and fertility


Each successive generation is smaller than that of its parents



Deaths and mortality


The fight against infectious diseases, the general improvement in living conditions and the development of medical techniques reduced mortality over the course of the 20th century



Marriages and registered partnerships


The institution of marriage is declining in favour of other forms of living together



Divorces and dissolved partnerships


A record number of divorces was recorded in 2010 with 22 100 legal dissolutions of marriage



The average length of marriage at time of divorce is increasing due to the fact that many divorces take place after 20 years or more of marriage




International and internal migration


Net internal migration, 2020

Ageing


There are ever fewer young people and ever more older people dependent on the working-age population


The percentage of older people grows each year


Population projections
